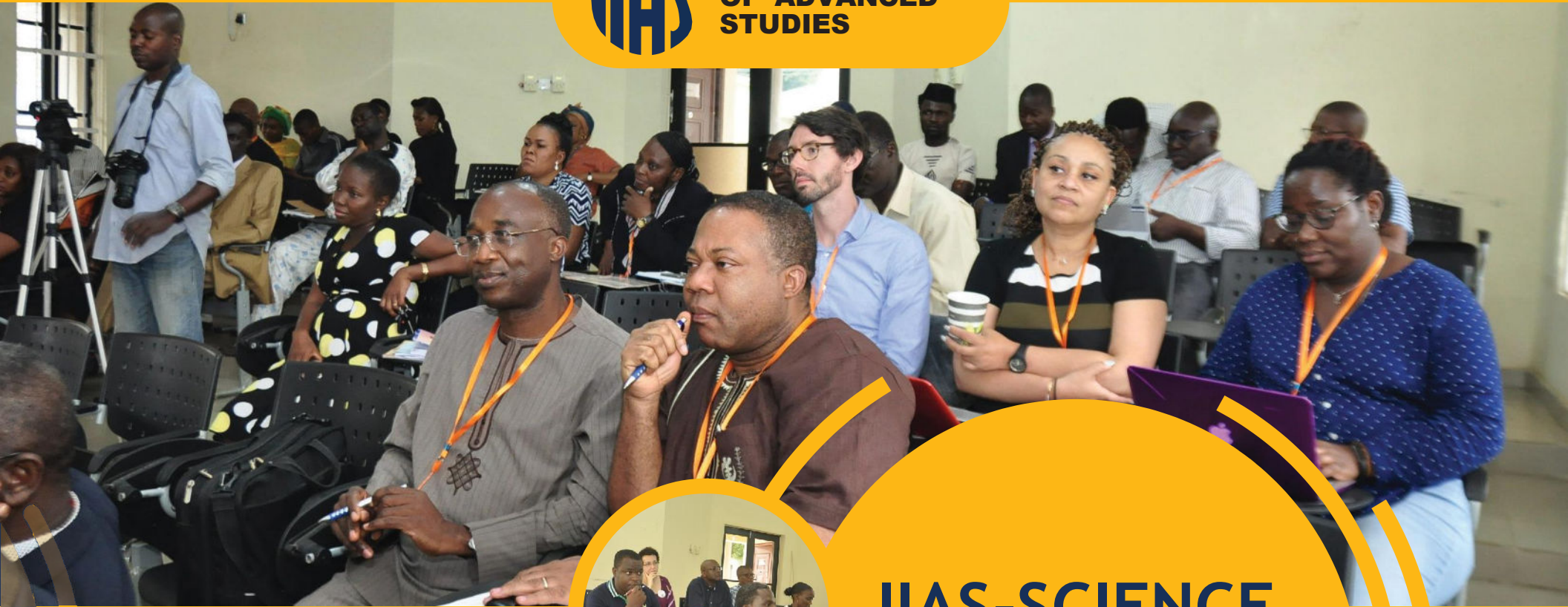

Prof. Afe Adogame



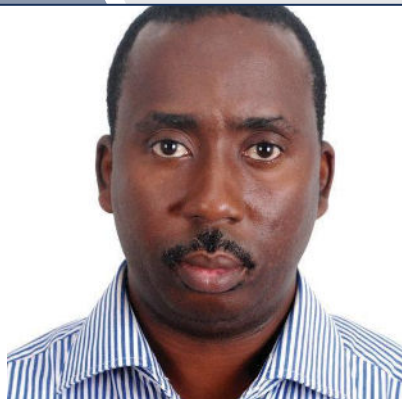

Prof. Eme Owoaje



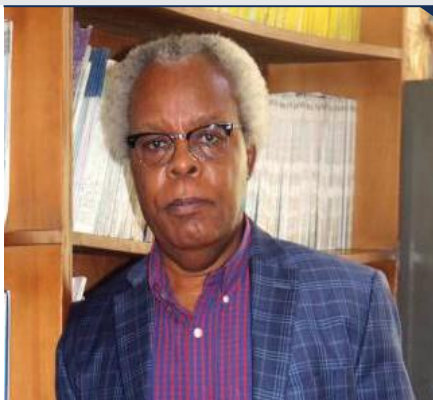
